# INTRODUCTION

**IN 2012, EDMONTON COMMUNITY FOUNDATION (ECF) GRANTED MORE THAN \$10.1 MILLION TO MORE THAN 430 REGISTERED CHARITIES AND 200 STUDENTS, PRIMARILY IN THE EDMONTON AREA. SINCE ITS INCEPTION IN 1989, ECF HAS GRANTED OVER \$150 MILLION! THESE GRANTS WERE PRIMARILY MADE FROM INCOME FROM PERMANENTLY ENDOWED FUNDS AND WERE MADE POSSIBLE BECAUSE OF THE GENEROUS SUPPORT OF DONORS, PAST AND PRESENT.**

Being an effective grant maker goes beyond cutting a cheque. ECF's role in the community includes acting as a sounding board for community agencies, collaborating with other funders, being a convenor and catalyst for change, and providing information about the charitable sector to our donors and others.

In the following pages, you will find summaries of the grants and awards made in 2012 and descriptions of each of our grant programs. They demonstrate the diversity of our community and of ECF's work and reflect some interesting trends.

- Several arts organizations have stepped up to fill a gap identified by the Mayor's Task Force on the Arts. The Task Force noted that many schools have reduced the arts programming they provide. In response, several arts organizations – including Brian Webb Dance Company, Catalyst Theatre, Azimuth Theatre and Wecan Society Trust (also known as Harcourt House Gallery) – have developed programming to take professional artists into schools, expose students to the arts, teach them some basic skills, and help build future audiences.
- ECF has always provided assistance to organizations serving those in our community in need of specialized support or services. In 2012, ECF noted several agencies responding to the needs of newcomers to Edmonton, including a new program for families of temporary foreign workers developed by Multicultural Family Resources Society, expansion of programs provided by the Africa Centre, sustained programs by the Edmonton Mennonite Centre for Newcomers to help newcomers become established in our community, and several initiatives for immigrant youth which were supported through the Youth Empowerment Program.
- It seems that an above average number of agencies are currently seeking funds for capital campaigns. For example, Capital Care Foundation, Fort Edmonton Foundation, CASA Child, Adolescent and Family Mental Health, Varscona Theatre Alliance Society, iHuman Youth Society, Compassion House Foundation, Stollery Children's Hospital Foundation, and Valour Place Society are all undertaking capital campaigns for building purchases or renovations and each received support from one or more donor advised funds.

- In the past year, several organizations from across our community have sought the assistance of consultants, who can provide one-time expertise on a pressing issue, to help build the capacity and strength of the organization over the long-term. Hope Foundation, HIV Network of Edmonton, Citadel Theatre, and iHuman Youth Society each received funding for consultant costs in 2012 to address concerns specific to their organizations.
- Two sectors which ECF serves – Environment and Health & Wellness – continue to grow as a percentage of our discretionary granting. In 2012, grants in the Environment sector included support to the Wildlife Rehabilitation Society and Big Lake Environment Support Society. Grants in Health & Wellness included support to Options Sexual Health Association, CASA Child, Adolescent and Family Mental Health, the MS Society, and the Steadward Centre at the University. Community & Social Services continue to receive the largest support, on a percentage basis, of ECF's discretionary funds.
- And finally, several grant requests were received this year from outside the City of Edmonton, helping ECF fulfil its geographic mandate of serving the greater Edmonton area. Grants made in 2012 included support for the Information & Volunteer Centre for Strathcona County, Sherwood Park Music Festival Association, Big Lake Environment Support Society, and Altview Foundation for Gender Variant and Sexual Minorities.

# GRANTING IN ACTION

## COMMUNITY GRANTS PROGRAM

Through its Community Grants Program, ECF supports requests from charities involved in arts, culture and heritage; education and learning; community and social services; health and wellness; recreation and leisure; and the environment and conservation. Funded activities must demonstrate benefits to the greater Edmonton area.

Community Grants are funded from the income of our Community and Field of Interest Funds, for which the donors have given ECF discretion over allocation of fund income. Support is also provided through the Community Investment Partnership, through which donors provide support to particular projects from donor advised funds or flow-through gifts. Granting decisions are made by the Board of ECF, with input from volunteer advisory committees and staff.

Priority is given to projects in low-income neighbourhoods which have less capacity to raise the funds necessary to build playgrounds and play spaces.
